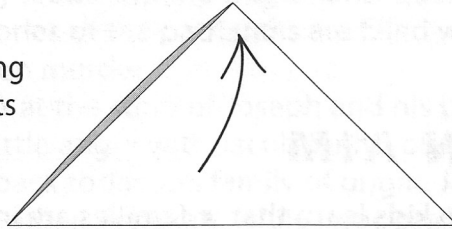


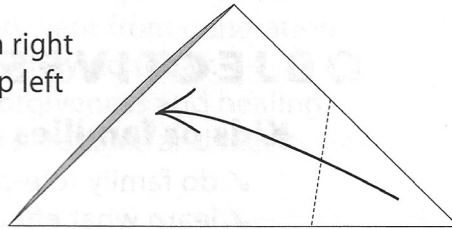
CUP OF FORGIVENESS

"Continue to show deep love for each other, for love covers a multitude of sins" (1 Peter 4:8).

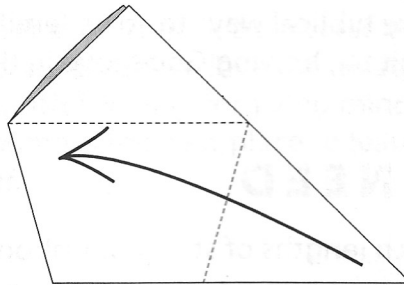
1. Fold a square of paper in half, forming a triangle that points upward.



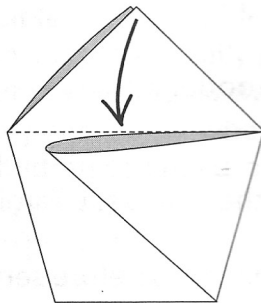
2. Fold the bottom right corner to the top left edge.



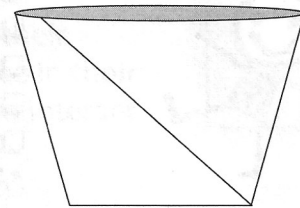
3. Turn the paper over. Fold the bottom right corner to the top left edge.

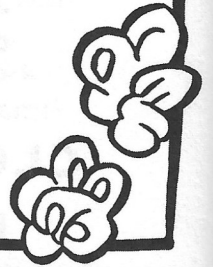

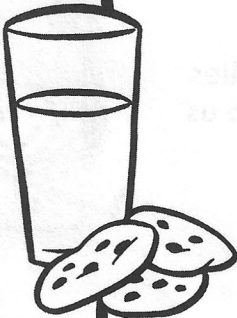
Just before bed one night, have hot chocolate and tell each other

Pop popcorn together. For each kernel you eat, tell one good thing about a family member or about God.



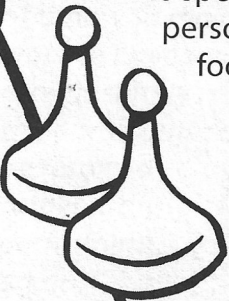
Surprise someone who's tired with a tray of cookies and juice. Give that person a foot rub while he or she enjoys the treat.

Plan a "You're Special" night for each family member. Have the special person's favorite food for dinner; then play his or her favorite game.

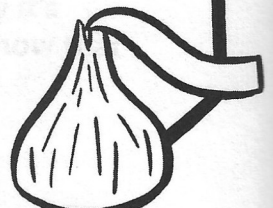


Purchase a package of self-stick notes and divide them among family members. Leave a happy secret message for each family member each day for a week.
